CHURCH AS GOD'S FIELD

1 Corinthians 3.1-15 // February 25, 2024

GIANTS AND INFANTS

Paul planted the church at Corinth, and Apollos later watered. Yet the Corinthians were not growing in maturity, but rather were remaining as infants in Christ. In our modern day, we have more rich, deep truths at our fingertips than we ever have in the history of the world, yet a large swath of the church is shallow, uncommitted to maturity or deep growth, accountability, and that is unprepared to endure hardships.

Hebrews 5.11-14

And while pastors and teachers have a massive role and responsibility in providing opportunities for growth, the problem of lack of growth is (usually) not the fault of those leaders (it certainly wasn't in the Corinthians' case!), but it is our lack of readying ourselves to receive the rain of God's grace into the plowed, tilled, and planted field of our own hearts.

TRAINING FOR READINESS

Paul is clear: we are to partake in the building of our life. We partake in the cultivating of this field. We must be ready to receive what God desires to give. And if we don't, the results are devastating.

Without God, you can't.
Without you, He won't.

TAKE MY YOKE UPON YOU

Every Jewish rabbi had their own way of interpreting Scripture and their way of how to live it out. They would call this their "yoke." A yoke is what an ox would wear when he was paired up with another ox so they could pull a plow to till a field, and so this was the rabbi's set of insights and way of life that they would plow the field of life. If you took on a rabbi's yoke, you were partnering with him to believe and live as he did.

We are all already bearing a yoke. The burden of guilt or shame, or of comparing ourselves to others, or of trying to force change in our lives. But Jesus invites us to come follow Him as our rabbi, and to partner with Him and take His yoke upon us.


Your Life Mission

What relationships or conversations are you needing more joy or wisdom for as you seek the Lord to help you bring the love of the Lord to them?

THE LORD'S P.R.A.Y.er MODEL

- Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)
 - Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.
- Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)
 - o Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.
- Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)
 - o Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.
- Yield with Thanksgiving (Matthew 6.10)
 - End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.
