## THE AROMA OF CHRIST

## THE LORD'S PRAYER

## **COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK**

Open the evening reciting the **Memory Verse** together. Then open to the **Call to Worship Psalm** and have someone open the night by *praying* the Psalm.

Read Matthew 6.9-13 and 2 Corinthians 2.14, 15. What stands out in these passages and from Sunday's sermon?

#### **Preaching the Gospel to Yourself**

When you think of praying the Lord's Prayer as a model, what comes to mind? Does it sound repetitive or empty? Or does it sound more like something that could really help you abide with Jesus? How would praying the Lord's Prayer and the Psalms help you to truly abide in the Vine more effectively, and why do you think those would help?

#### Your Life Mission

For us to be pouring ourselves for the sake of others, we must be first filled. And though we know that we are already filled in Christ, we also know that we don't often operate *from* that filling. This is why we must aim to be built up in Christ: not just for our sakes, but for the sake of those around us! What "building materials" from the **LifeMAPs** (or from elsewhere) are you wanting to add to your trellis so that you can cultivate vibrant Vine growth so that you can more richly walk as an ambassador for Christ? Close your group time with someone each taking one of four main elements of the Lord's Prayer and praying them for the group.

### THE LORD'S P.R.A.Y.er MODEL

#### Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)

 Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.

### Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)

o Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.


#### Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)

o Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.

## Yield with Thanksgiving (Matthew 6.10)

 End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.
