1 Corinthians 3.9-17, 6.19, 20 // March 17, 2024

SURVIVING OR THRIVING?

The picture we get in **1 Corinthians 3.9-17** is as much a picture of the work Christ alone has done as it is also a picture of the work that we must do. We know that salvation comes only by grace through faith as a gift of God, yet we also much know that we are expected to respond to that, turning from sin and turning towards Jesus each and every day.

1 Timothy 4.7 // Romans 8.1, 2, 15

The Law of Sin is like the Law of Gravity. You can break American laws, but you can't break the Law of Gravity. Sin is like a gravitational pull that we must obey before we are alive in Christ. But when the Holy Spirit makes us alive, He not only enlivens us on the inside, but He also opens the prison cell of sin and death. We can now *freely* walk away from sin because that Law of Sin has been broken.

THE PURSUIT OF HOLINESS

Romans 6.1, 2

The Roman Christians understood what Paul was saying about Christ doing all the work of salvation. But what they didn't understand is what their response should be. They wondered `if this is true, can we just continue in sin since Jesus said ``it is finished?"' But Paul lets them know that is a wrong view. He asks, "why would you even *think* of continuing in your old way if you've been given this amazing gift!?"

Titus 2.11-14 // Ephesians 2.8-10, 18-22

We are not saved by good works, but we are saved for good works.

DEMOLITION AND CONSTRUCTION

Sometimes, part of our construction process must include some demolition work. We are called to confess sin, flee sin, and not make excuses by justifying sin. We are to *put off* the old self and put away our former way of sinning.

Though we are indeed the temple of the Holy Spirit, We are still able to grieve the Holy Spirit.

Ephesians 5.7-21 // Timothy 2.21, 22

Definition of Commitment: Falling in love with something and then building a structure of behavior around it for the moments when love falters.

Your Life Mission

Worship is the very fuel of missions. Read **Hebrews 12.1, 2.** Why is it important for us to lay aside the weight of sin in our pursuit of being effective ambassadors? What sin needs to be confessed and repented of that has been holding you back and in your prison cell? What kind of help do you need to be able to walk free of that?

THE LORD'S P.R.A.Y.er MODEL


- Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)
 - Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.
- Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)
- Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.
- Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)
- Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.

Yield with Thanksgiving (Matthew 6.10)

• End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.


