CHURCH AS A ROYAL PRIESTHOOD

1 Peter 2.4-12 // March 24, 2024

THE PRIESTHOOD OF EVERY BELIEVER

Priests are representatives, specially appointed people to go to God on behalf of others. But God's original design is that we would all be able to go to Him, face to face, as Adam and Eve did. However, due to sin, this is not possible. Priests were set apart for that task, and one specific High Priest would make atonement for sin once per year. But this can't be a "forever" plan, because each High Priest was a sinner, and the sacrifices, being animals, were insufficient to atone for the sins of humans.

Exodus 19.3-6 // Hebrews 9.11-15, 24 // Romans 8.1-4

Only man *should* be our redeemer, But man *could not* be our redeemer. God alone *could* be our redeemer, But *could not* be our redeemer.

TAKING UP OUR RABBI'S YOKE

We saw a few weeks ago that young Jewish kids would go to school to learn the Scriptures, but only the best of the class would continue, hoping to be chosen to apprentice under a rabbi, "yoking" themselves up with his way of life and teaching. Jesus, however, breaks the mold by inviting *whoever* that would come to Him. *Anyone* that comes to Him, He will gladly receive to follow Him.

John 6.37-40 // Acts 4.13

Jesus does not call the equipped, He equips the called.

COME FOLLOW ME

1 Peter 2.4-12 // Hebrews 12.1, 2

And now we can all be priests in His Kingdom. We bring sacrifices, but not for salvation, as that has been paid for. But our sacrifices are our *response* to this gift of salvation. I am to be a living sacrifice, giving praise rather than complaint, confession over hiding, thanksgiving over discontentment, service to God and people rather than self, of offering forgiveness rather than bitterness.

And though these good deeds are riddled with bad motive, Jesus my High Priest burns the sin from these sacrifices and He Himself offers them to His Father purified on our behalf, so we can boldly serve the Lord in all of our life. This Week's Call to Worship Psalm:

THE LORD'S P.R.A.Y.er MODEL


Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)

- Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)
- Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.
- Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)
- Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.


