Paul makes it clear that the church is the household of God, and he is writing so that we would know how to behave *as* the household of God. But the reason he has to write this, is *because we often don't* act like the household of God!

Like our biological family, we haven't chosen our spiritual family. But in God's wisdom, they have been chosen for us,

PREMEDITATED RESENTMENTS

Though we all *should* act better than our biological families do, we are an "Already/Not Yet" family, nonetheless. Yes, we are "already" the household of God, but we are still "not yet" fully formed as the household of God.

THE LORD'S P.R.A.Y.er MODEL

Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)

 Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.

• Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)

o Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.


Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)

o Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Yield with Thanksgiving (Matthew 6.10)
