ENCOURAGING THE CHURCH

Acts 20.1-14 // May 5, 2024

COMING ALONGSIDE

Paul's heart and passion was to encourage people in their faith and build them up. We see him traveling and pouring out his life for the encouragement of other churches and believers, desiring to see them strengthened.

Encouragement: the Greek word used is "parakaleo." "Kaleo" means "to speak," and para means "to help" or "come alongside."

Encouragement is the oxygen of the soul.

Proverbs 18.21

MANY WAYS TO ENCOURAGE

The churches were in need of encouragement. There were riots in response to their changed lives, there was persecution, there was financial struggles, there were divisions and false teachers, and there was unrepentant sin.

Hebrews 10.24, 25

- **Gather:** The church was hungry for the Word. They gathered to be encouraged by God's Word and by the presence of others.
- Eat Together: The most meaningful conversations and encouragement happens around food and drink, be it meals, coffee, or just being in each others' homes.
- Serve: They served one another. They were consumers, but contributors.
- Give: They gave sacrificially, even when they had little, and did it cheerfully.

HELPING OTHERS

Another purpose of Paul's trips to the church was that he was taking up an offering to help the poor church in Jerusalem. He encouraged the churches he visited, while also taking up encouragement to be delivered to others!

With all the stats and needs around the world and even within our own church, it is easy to believe the lie that the church is failing. But the Word reminds us that the gates of hell will not prevail against the church. We are more than conquerors through Christ.


